## **Carroll County Early Childhood Coalition Meeting Notes**

Tuesday, February 28th: 12 noon-1:30pm Children Unlimited, Conway, NH

**Welcome:** Emily welcomed everyone and invited folks to introduce themselves and share one success and one challenge in their work:

- Christine: First "Crossings" gathering was held at MWV Children's Museum. Please keep this children's grief program in mind if anyone knows of a child who has experienced a loss.
- Shannon: Very busy with training and event planning, which is both a success and challenge. Poverty Trainings have been very popular: <u>https://www.eventbrite.com/e/31117-saturday-special-training-day-bridges-out-of-poverty-strategies-for-professionals-and-registration-31462223357</u>
- Diane: Head Start has a new printer/copier, both success and challenge!
- Amy St. Pierre: representing Waldorf Early Childhood programs, have been able to help families in need of services with 211, challenge to find time to renew staff and ensure their own health is being taken care
- Cassie: NHS ESS very busy, with an increase in referrals for kids since the holidays
- Katie McCarthy: great progress is being seen with many children in Children Unlimited programs, very exciting to see. However, recent local suicide is taking its toll on many families in their program. Very glad she can refer them to the "Crossings" program.
- Tara: VROOM is being implemented into their storytime at Conway Library, still trying to have more families take part in their programs
- Gail: SAU9 has received 4 recent referrals from PreK programs for kids to evaluate.
- Pam: SAU9 just returning from vacation, so far children seem to be settling back into school routines very well.
- Schelley: HFA program is full, but there will be openings as kids age out of the program
- Bill: Resilience Counseling and Training Center has a variety of resources and programs available. Upcoming ones include a Grandparenting 101 course (see attached info) as well as a 6-hr professional development workshop for the UNH Professional Development & Training Office this May on "*Resilience-Based Classroom Behavior Management*" (see attached flyer) This teacher training workshop might be of interest to some EC educators and program directors given that national stats indicate 70% of school expulsions & suspensions occur at the pre-school level. This workshop will be held at the UNH Manchester campus. If there is sufficient interest Bill could also offer it locally.

**Website Review:** Everyone reviewed the early childhood section of the website. Members were asked to keep in mind any other info to include.

**Home-visiting Program Update:** Head Start, HFA, NHS and Children Unlimited Programs all doing well, but referrals are always needed as children age out of programs and openings result. Continue to see few referrals direct from Primary Care Providers

**Developmental Screenings Update:** Children Unlimited Watch Me Grow staff person has been reaching out to childcare programs to talk about Watch Me Grow and educate about ASQ process, however she is recovering from a car accident at the present, luckily returning to work soon.

## Other programs & activities:

- Care Transition Team Meeting at Memorial Hospital 2/2: Panel presentation about current services available in region, followed by good discussion regarding referrals process to special services for children. It is especially important to simplify the process for maternity/primary care providers. Next meeting on 3/2 will continue the discussion. Need to focus on challenges in transition of care from hospital/primary care settings to home. How can case managers be better informed?

- Raising MWV Projects: (\*county-wide effort)
  - Bedrock of the Granite State Training\*: Anyone who would like to be trained to present Bedrock can attend a training on March 29<sup>th</sup> at SAU9, exact time to be determined.   - None of the school districts in SAU9 will be asking for funds to support early childhood programming for the 2017-2018 school year, but work on this issues continues.
  - **VROOM**\* is being implemented to help families acquire skills and activities to enhance their children's development and learning:
    - $\circ~$  Funding provides app cards, posters and production of a radio PSA by WMWV
    - App cards were passed out to organizations at the meeting, and are also being distributed to the Carroll County House of Corrections, Memorial Hospital Maternity Dept and will be distributed following Bedrock presentations.
    - Everyone listened to the Radio PSA draft, agreeing that it would be nice to have Carroll County Early Childhood Coalition mentioned instead of only Carroll County Coalition for Public Health.
    - HFA, NHS and CU requested 5 sets of tip cards if possible. Emily will see if there is still funding available.
- Kindergarten Readiness Program 2017:
