- 6 moms involved in New Life @ Memorial and Healthy Families America
- Recovery Coach Training in CC 13 completed academy training at WhiteHorse Treatment Rebecca Ayer – overdose trends are in Carroll County – Recovery Community needs more support/coach –no place for them yet, conversation should be starting about a centralized place for the Recovery Coaches, Memorial Hospital a possibility?
- SBIRT (screening, brief intervention and referral to treatment) and Motivation Interview Training provide through White Mountain Community Health
- SBIRT and alternate sentencing through White Mountain Restorative Justice
- **PAARI (Police Assisted Addiction Recovery Initiative: paariusa.org)** out of state treatment beds access bus tickets, transportation, working to connect our law enforcement who have enrolled with the program to local options for addiction recovery and supports such as recovery support coaches
- Dartmouth Hitchcock providing
   – Free Aids Testing Monday June 27<sup>th</sup>, Tamworth Community Nurses
