## Advocacy opportunities

## **NH SB 85**

A critical bill for children's behavioral health in New Hampshire heads to the House floor for a vote tomorrow 5/18/23. There's still time to get in touch with your representatives to ensure they cast a vote that supports behavioral health for youth in New Hampshire.

Late last month, the House Health, Human Services and Elderly Affairs Committee narrowly voted along party lines to recommend defeating <u>SB 85</u>, a bill that would eliminate <u>preauthorization requirements in mental health emergencies</u>. Currently, children and adults who go to emergency departments for behavioral health crises may have to wait for preauthorization from their insurance carrier before they are transferred to a more appropriate setting for treatment.

The bill also supports permanent funding for the state's 988 mobile crisis team - without passage, the state's 988 program may not have a sustainable funding source that can meet the needs of Granite Staters.

Will you email or call your representatives to ask them to overturn the Committee recommendation and PASS SB 85 using our easy action email form?
