Goals for Year 5	 Sustainability planning Susan Ward/NAMI- Connect Training and Planning Session – two days session. Day one is a Connect suicide prevention training and everyone is invited to attend. Day two is a planning session- leadership/decision makers from all community sectors get together to look at best practices regarding suicide prevention (e.g. looking at their safe messaging, lethal means reduction protocols) and determine what needs to be updated/worked on and it gives everyone opportunities to collaborate. Carroll County could look back and determine if we've made improvements to our conclusions from Year 1. Potential dates for the planning session are May 20 and 21 (select people could skip day one if they are well-versed in the Connect trainings). The group agrees that a hybrid planning session would be best. Postvention planning session in the fall. 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Education and Training - NAMI Update – Susan Ward	 Anika Hastings/GWRSD- GWRSD trained 355 staff on March 12! All professional and support staff were invited to attend in 6 buildings with 14 presenters. Did exit survey that could be shared to Susan and Catalina, about 75% said they'd rather do an in-person training than virtual. On March 28, GWRSD is doing a Youth Connect training where youth will train other youth.
