Task: Produce a revised copy of the Carroll County Health Improvement Plan for 2020-2025

Idea: Give a name to the CHIP Revision Process?

***Carroll County Promise 2025** for the Carroll County Community Health Improvement Plan?*

The purpose of the Carroll County Promise 2025 Community Health Improvement Plan (C.H.I.P.) is to honor the wisdom of the 2015 work [undertaken to develop the original C.H.I.P.] and build upon it to provide a refreshed framework for community and public health practice, research, education, funding, and policy.

The goal of the Carroll County Promise 2025 Health Improvement Plan **is to ensure current community needs data, evidence-based practices, and alignment with local, state, and national plans drive the organization and prioritization of focus areas cited within the C.H.I.P.**

Approaches needed to achieve this goal are:

- Engage public health and community stakeholders to assess the current state of use of the CHIP
- Updating/refreshing the Community Health Improvement Plan, with Carroll County's most relevant data and information available

How does this resonate with you?

Approach: Updating/refreshing the CHIP with the Capital Area's most relevant data and information available

Phase 1:

- Provide an overview of progress made toward current CHIP priorities.
- Draft overview of most recent Community Needs Assessments (Huggins and Memorial) findings and its alignment to current CHIP.

Phase 2:

- Organize new data, information and themes collected from stakeholder feedback
- Update priorities
- Incorporate changes into revised CHIP document

****Where does lead poisoning prevention fit in? *Early Childhood? SDOH? Both?***

Proposed Timeline:

May 2020: Complete CHIP Revision proposal outline.

June 2020: Present this outline to the Carroll County PHAC EC

July – August 2020: Begin to build on PHAC EC suggestions, fill in data sources, add contextual factors. Begin building draft 2020 CHIP revision.

September 2020: Present outline of CHIP draft to full PHAC (ideally Annual Meeting, will need to determine what the COVID situation is at that time. If not, present virtually). Offer “polling” option (e.g. dots exercise) for full PHAC to give input on priorities.

October – November 2020: Complete draft of CHIP revision, based on PHAC input.

November 2020: Submit draft of CHIP revision to GUV Leadership (Lauren M. & Shannon B.)

December 2020: Final Carroll County CHIP 2021 – 2025 is submitted to NH DHHS, DPHS.
