### **Announcements**

- MWV Adult Day Center opening Monday, June 29th. Working through the NH DHHS guidelines now.
- Gibson Center opening Monday, June 29th. Details being worked out. Talking to N Conway Community Center to explore lawn activities, maybe multi-generational, to bring some programming back. Working out thrift store re-opening details. (handling donations, for example)
- Huggins. Still closed to general visitors. Received state info on impact to hospitals through NH Hospital Associat.
- Senator Shaheen is working on PPPP bill. Surge in new cases will continue to have impact on national economy.
- Jennifer: Wolfeboro area looking like typical summer level of activity. Mixed use of masks or no masks.
- Marianne: Can PHAC message the community about the importance of masks, that some will not patronize businesses that don't carry out precautions.
- Interest among PHAC to join any Wolfeboro Chamber online meetings to network with business community. MWV Chamber meetings are being attended by Caleb, Catalina, Chuck regularly.
- Lead Poisoning Prevention: Reaching out to 3M for donation of lead test kits.
- Garrett Lee Smith Suicide Prevention Grant: NAMI-NH heading up a grant from SAMHSA suicide prevention grant for Carroll/North Country. 5 year grant. Care Liaison hired at Northern Human services to manage care transitions post NH Hospital for attempt survivors into behavioral care services. PHN will stand up an implementation team. Community Colleges will partner for community education. Online training modules will be available for educators to meet training requirements, and wider community. Focus on youth, young adults 10-25.
