#7 Protocols for resource referral when family declines/refuses treatment: Persons at risk and their family members including parents/guardians are informed about resources and supports related to mental health and suicide prevention if their loved one is at risk. Discussed the importance of having these protocols in place before these situations happen. Mckenzie/Care Liaison- If clients decline services with her, she provides them with the 988 and NH Rapid Response Access Point numbers, along with the Northern Human Services local number and her number and lets them know if anything changes, they can always call her. Susan/NAMI- Connect trainings have guidelines for if someone is not high risk or if they are high risk.	
#8 Persons receiving MH services receive advice on treatment options specific to suicide risk/prevention: Persons receiving mental health services and their support system are advised of what evidence-based treatment options exist specifically to address suicide risk.	N/A- No clinicians are present at the meeting today.	
#9 Confidentiality. Providers are informed on parameters of confidential exchange of information: Providers and community members are informed about the parameters of confidentiality to include how and when to share/exchange information in potentially lifethreatening situations.	In the past there have been some concerns from people in public education about how much info get shared between school personnel about a particular youth/family and the communications between guidance/nursing/etc. and with emergency room or law enforcement and the family. In the past, there was also confusion about student privacy and health information, HIPPA, consent and release about information. Susan/NAMI- Discussed importance of creating, following, and revisiting these protocols and procedures (consider school districts with multiple schools and siblings in different schools). If it's a life-threatening situation, then those policies don't apply.







