Working Together

Drug use at Kingswood Regional High School is higher than the state average; and NH is higher than the national average. ⁽¹⁾ Also, NH has the second highest death rate in the nation due to drugs. In NH, the age for drug use often begins before age 13. How did this happen? **Because we have not united together as a community to say:**

> "Not here, Not in our community; Not in our schools!"

Drugs increase the crime rate, keep children from learning, make people non-productive, separate families and destroy lives!

Drug Prevention

Drug prevention is the key! Encouraging our youth to say "No" to drugs is essential to creating a Drug Free Community.

Drug Prevention (education) needs to start at an early age. Since many youth start before age 13, then messages about the risks of substance abuse and the benefits of a healthy lifestyle must start by age 8 and continue through the mid 20s. This requires Community!

There are many mixed messages today about drugs. For example, Legalization vs decriminalization of marijuana. Maine and Massachusetts made marijuana legal. NH is keeping it illegal. This confusion leads many to believe that marijuana is much like alcohol. It is not!

Education and awareness throughout the community is essential.. Typically, a dollar spent on drug prevention can save \$10-\$20 dollars on drug treatment and rehabilitation.

Drug Intervention

Intervention occurs when loved ones confront a person with substance use disorder to encourage treatment. It is difficult and success is never guaranteed, but it is often required. Loved ones may want to use the services of professionals to help them prior to the intervention.

Drug Treatment

Often, after a successful intervention, the individual needs to receive treatment services for the specific addiction as soon as possible. White Horse Addiction Center in Ossipee is the only facility currently in southern Carroll County.

Drug Recovery Support

It is important the Community provide ongoing recovery support, often this is peer support groups. Other assets in the community can be identified and made functional. Recovery support is essential, so that the cycle is broken.

Marijuana – The Door to Addiction

The dangers of Marijuana are significantly more today because Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) is 10-20 times stronger than marijuana in the 1960s. Therefore, THC stays in the body weeks or months, attacking the body and increasing the risks of:

- <u>Behavior Problems</u> -Marijuana can cause panic, hallucinations, paranoia, and psychosis.

- <u>Sexual Reproduction</u> -Marijuana use affects male reproduction.
- <u>Birth defects</u> Marijuana generates birth defects in infants including leukemia.
